

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SHAOLIN SÁNDOR LIU VS ELLIE CHRISTIE AND JAGUAR


This happened last year in the ice and snow and we rather overlooked it. A pity because the Jaguar XE 300 SPORT set a unique lap record. The special edition sports saloon became the first car to complete a flying lap of the world's longest artificial outdoor ice circuit, at Flevonice in the Netherlands - but it had to beat a Winter Olympic gold medallist skater to set the fastest time. After anchoring Hungary to gold in the 5,000m relay at the 2018 Winter Olympics, speed skater Shaolin Sándor Liu set a tough benchmark, negotiating the track at Flevonice Sports and Funpark in 4 minutes 4 seconds.



It's the near future, and by day the world is very much like the one we know now. But when dusk falls, the shutters come down, the streets are cleared and a curfew is enforced. It's in place to protect the population from a virus that's sweeping the country. But some people think the rules that come with it are too great a price to pay.

And so there's the race, an illegal contest set up by an elusive tech billionaire. Over one long, crazy life-changing night, 25 teams set off at breakneck speed in South London and don't let up until they cross the finish line in the Scottish Highlands. And there can only be one winner.

Alliances will be won and lost, friendships made and broken, lovers and lives ripped apart. And each team will be pushed to the very limit. All in pursuit of the ultimate prize: the chance to escape the world of the curfew for a life in a better place.

Starring an ensemble cast including Sean Bean, Billy Zane, Miranda Richardson, Adrian Lester, Adam Brody, Phoebe Fox and Malachi Kirby, Curfew is an insane blast of chrome and diesel, with relatable characters, moving storylines and thrilling spectacle. It's a real, popcorn, blockbuster treat. Here are some Episode teasers...

EPISODE 1 Paramedic Kaye's carefully ordered life is shaken up when her sister Ruby, and Ruby's boyfriend Michael, crash back into it. Ruby has bust Michael out of a secure medical facility, and they are all set to "race themselves free". Complicating things further is the small matter Michael and Kaye were once an item. Does she ignore her instincts and join the race? Meanwhile, in suburbia, the Donahue family load up their Volvo. They're nervous as hell about competing but have no choice: their world's no longer one they want to live in. But is something else behind their bid to escape?

EPISODE 2 The race begins. The Donahues have to come to terms with a major setback, which hits them hard both logistically and emotionally. As Roman helps them successfully dodge the obstacles the race starts to throw at them, they realise just how dangerous the road ahead is going to be. And they reach out to Kaye, Michael and Ruby for help crossing the River Thames when their plan starts to, quite literally, backfire.

EPISODE 3 The remaining racers have crossed the river. But now they' re faced with an even bigger hurdle: somehow navigating the huge wall that surrounds London. Short-tempered gangster The General and his pregnant girlfriend, Faith, plan to sneak their souped-up Jag out of the city on the back of a lorry. But can he keep his cool? Meanwhile, as the Volvo and the ambulance weave through a network of secret tunnels, Jenny becomes increasingly anxious. And Ruby moves closer and closer to the edge as the chemistry between Kaye and Michael starts to fizz.



Why does The General enter the race?

I think The General is someone who wants to make a fresh start. He's had a lot of tragedy in his life, he's lost his children, and he wants to make a new life with [his girlfriend] Faith.She's pregnant and they're desperate to take this baby to a new place and start a new life. I don't know if it'll be a straight life, but probably an improvement on his past.

Tell us about The General's history with Michael?

There's a kind of animosity, because we arranged to go on a bank robbery together and he let me down. He comes to me with a proposition and I remind him that I don't forget things like that, so he's already got him on the back foot. The General's always pushing for something and is very manipulative and there are these very strange mood changes he has, so it's like dealing with a caged tiger - you just don't know what he's gonna do.

The General helps some of the other characters in the race – but is a deal with The General a deal with the devil?

There's a price to pay. He's not doing it out of the goodness of his heart and he's got a memory like an elephant, so he's not going to forget your payback.

Tell us about The General's relationship with Faith. Is he protective of her?

Because of what happened in the past, he's really cautious and careful about the baby. He likes Faith, but I think that's the focus of his attention, to keep this child wrapped in cotton wool.


What three words best describe Curfew as a series?

Dangerous, exciting and ominous. Funny, as well. And what was it that attracted you to the project? It's something different and I thought it was quite relevant to what's happening today. I wouldn't say [we're in] police states, but it's going in that direction. Things are getting quite militarised in America and you wouldn't like to think that will happen here, but that's what happening in our story. I always find those dystopian tales and images quite fascinating – this kind of comparisons to 1984 and stuff like that. I'm just fascinated by that darkness – it's seems to be a very subterranean society that people are living in. There's no communication, there's just a darkness and a curfew, but there are these few people who want to get out of it, who are eccentric and free thinkers, and I think many of them are involved in this race.









Stranded and probably collecting a P45 by the end of the week. He not only saved many careers but many millions of pounds for those of us keen to do repairs ourselves.

Our Editor has a few personal words about the great man.

aynes did not just print manuals they also covered all sorts of motoring subjects, including model histories and motorsport. Indeed they published my first book, Dealing with Car Dealers in 1987 and several more. I was lucky enough to meet the great man in the early 2000s and he was as passionate and enthusiastic about cars as ever. Indeed, he had just bought a Lexus SC430 and was keen to share the experience. He handed me the keys and said, "take it for a spin". Behind him, the press relations man was shaking his head furiously and the keys were quietly taken from me before I left the publishing head office in Somerset. Here are a few words about his remarkable life as released by his family.

John Haynes, the entrepreneur and creator of the Haynes Manual, founder of the Haynes Publishing Group PLC and the Haynes International Motor Museum passed away peacefully, surrounded by family, on the evening of Friday 8thFebruary, aged 80, after a short illness. John was a kind, generous, loving and devoted husband, brother, father and grandfather, who will be missed enormously.

John Harold Haynes was born on 25thMarch 1938 to Harold and Violette Haynes in Ceylon, where his father was themanager of a tea plantation. From an early age John had a passion for cars, and as a child he loved nothing more than riding around the plantation with his father in their Morris 8 saloon.

At the age of 12 he moved to the UK with his brother David, to attend boarding school at Sutton Valence School in Kent. It was at schoolthat John's flair for art and his entrepreneurial spirit developed and flourished. He persuaded his House Master to allow him to miss rugby and instead spend his time converting an Austin 7 into alightweight sporty Austin 7 'Special'. He eventually sold the car, making a reasonable profit, and owing to the immense interest it received (over 150 replies to the advert) he decided to produce a booklet showing other enthusiasts how he'd made it. He published a booklet entitled "Building A '750' Special'; the first print run of 250 copies sold out in 10 days.

After leaving school John joined the Royal Air Force (RAF) to do his National Service, where he made many lifelong friends. During his time inthe RAF his role in logistics taught him business management skills, while enabling him to pursue his passion for motor racing and publishing in his spare time. He successfully developed and competitively raced

several race cars, including his Elva Courier, which is on display in the Havnes International Motor Museum.

It was whilst in the RAF that 'Johnny' met Annette, and he soon realised he had met the woman he wanted to spend his life with. On his way to their wedding he stopped to buyAnnette asecond hand IBM Proportional Space Type Writer as her wedding present. Although perhaps not the most romantic of gifts, Annette was delighted with his practical choice, setting the stage for a bright future together.

In 1965, John was posted to Aden and it was therethat he created the firstHaynes Manual. An RAF colleague had bought a 'Frogeye' Sprite, which was in poor condition and he asked John to help him rebuild it. John agreed, and quickly realised that the official factory manual was not designed to help the average car owner. He bought a camera and captured the process of dismantling and rebuilding the engine. The use of step-by-step photo sequences linked to exploded diagrams became the trusted hallmark of Haynes Manuals. The first Haynes Manual, for the Austin Healey Sprite, was published in 1966, and the first print run of 3,000 sold out in less than 3 months. To date over 200 million Haynes Manuals have been sold around the world.

The success of his publishing business, including expansion into Europe and North America, culminated in the Haynes Publishing Group PLC floating on the London Stock Exchange in 1979. In 1995 John was awarded an OBE for services to publishing, and in 2005 The Open University presented him with the honorary degree of Master of the University.

John's publishing success meant that he was able to enjoy his passion for cars, and he became a prolific collector. In 1985 he founded the Haynes International Motor Museum in Sparkford, Somerset as an Educational Charitable Trust, bequeathing his collection of 30 cars to the charity to be held for the benefit of the nation. John continued to support the museum charity throughout his life by donating cars and funding its growth, and thanks to his support the museum has grown and now displays more than 400 vehicles, and is enjoyed by over 125,000 people a year. At the 2014 International Historic Motoring Awards the museum was recognised as The Museum of the Year.

Until 2010 John served as Chairman of the Haynes Publishing Group and then continued to play an active role as Founder Director. In this role he supported the executive team as they created a world leading content, data and solutions business serving both drivers and professional mechanics. He combined this role with that of Chairman of Trustees of the Havnes International Motor Museum.



Young, struggling musicians Ray and Don are evicted from their South London squat. Hello Paul, we have watched Burning Man and your Volvo is pretty much in every scene.

Yes, the car is the star.

What can you tell us about your Volvo. Have you been together long? I bought the Volvo 131 in 1989 from a man who repaired them in Putney.

What state was it in when you bought and any plans for a repaint?

I started getting it repaired almost immeadiately. It had been resprayed before I got it, but almost immeadiatley both front wings were replaced. After that I never thought there was much point in doing too much to it. It has been hit from behind twice and I had to find another boot. I'm using it most days in London and most people don't drive very carefully, so daft to do anything else..

How come the Volvo is in the film?

Neil Spence lived opposite and when he and Jeremy Wooding were writing the script they could see the Volvo in the street the whole time. So they asked me if they could use it in the film. I said yes and ended up driving it over 1500 miles. I went through Norfolk to Yarmouth, over the Hull Bridge and into Yorkshire.

Was the Volvo well behaved during the filming?

Yes it was great. At one point it did become very difficult to engage gear and made a bit of a noise. We looked into it and and all it needed was a universal joint and that cost £80 to sort out. That is the brilliant thing about older cars in that they are easy to fix. Diesel was once got put in the tank by mistake and it was easy enough to suck out and be on its way, even though the fuel went around the system.

Is there anything this Volvo needs?

A heater. That really needs to be fixed.

This car isn't just a film star is it?

I like taking pictures of it in strage and atmospheric places. You can see the images here: http://cargocollective.com/131amazon It has been used in an exhibition and been laser cut in metal in three pieces, it has been brilliantly done. You can also dine with the Volvo at Mario's Cafe in Kentish Town.

Are there any plans to swap the Volvo for something more modern?

Running an old car, especially when it works, is the most environmental thing that you can do. The Volvo is me. I always imagined that it would end up in a field with foxes living in it. Even more likely is that one day it will be up on bricks outside my house.



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ree Car Mag believe that tyres are the four most important parts of your car. That's why we are fitting a tyre pressure system to a couple of our fleet cars. These fit any make/model of car/4x4/van, but are particularly suitable for an older vehicle which won't have any kind of TPMS as standard (although even in modern cars with an OE-spec TPMS, this system is far superior and adds a lot of value). It's wireless and easily fitted in a matter of minutes, and can be supplied with up to four sensors for a trailer too – so it's also great for those with a tow car, for your typical caravan/horsebox set-up. Michelin TPMS is a full blown TPMS system (RRP: £79.95), whereas the Michelin Tyre Pressure Checker consists simply of four new valve caps and a great little keyring tool which

you just hold up against the valve to get a precise pressure reading. So for people who don't want active pressure monitoring on the go, it allows them to check their pressures before a long journey in a matter of seconds – and without unscrewing valve caps and connecting a pressure gauge (which as you know, actually removes air from the tyre).
