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



Yes that's right, the Abarth 124 spider takes a starring role I alongside Sting & Shaggy in the official music video for their new track, "Gotta Get Back My Baby" – the latest single, coproduced by Teflon (Wyclef Jean, Fat Joe, Ruff Ryders) and Martin Kierszenbaum (Sting, Mylène Farmer, Lady Gaga), off their album, 44/876, which has spent 17 weeks atop the Billboard Reggae chart. The official YouTube music video, which amassed over 2.3 million views in just a few days, was filmed in the vein of '80s and '90s buddy cop television series and movies including "Miami Vice" and "Bad Boys," and was directed by Michael Garcia. The video pairs Sting and Shaggy as two Miami detectives who convince their Captain that they' re "going to need the spider" - meaning his prized Abarth 124 spider - as part of their South Beach stake-out for "the most dangerous woman in the country." What could go wrong?!

Sting & Shaggy's album 44/876(Cherrytree/A&M/Interscope Records) is available now for digital download through streaming and digital subscription services. The iconic duo initially joined forces to record a new song, "Don' t Make Me Wait" (which debuted at #1 on Billboard' s digital reggae singles chart), as a tribute to the Caribbean sounds that influenced them both and ended up creating an entire album full of joyful and uplifting, melodic music. With its title referencing their respective telephone country codes (44 for the UK, Sting's birthplace and 876 for Jamaica, Shaggy's homeland), 44/876 honors the duo's deeprooted love for Jamaica: Shaggy's birthplace, and where Sting penned such classics as "Every Breath You Take."


Sting & Shaggy have extended their collaboration to the road for lauded world tour, combining their respective bands to perform their greatest hits as well as new songs off 44/876, together.



motoreasy Reliability

MotorEasy has analysed nearly 40,000 years' worth of car ownership to establish how likely your car is to let you down; and how expensive it will be to fix. Using a combination of these it's been able to rank the reliability of every major manufacturer.







UBARU has topped a new list of the most reliable cars on UK roads, proving by far the least likely to break down.

The Japanese purveyors of the Impreza, Forester, Outback and BRZ trounced the competition - with nearest rival Honda proving almost four times more likely to need a repair.

But it was bad news for Alfa Romeo and Land Rover owners - as the manufacturers slumped to the back of the reliability race.

The stats were compiled by MotorEasy, the UK's fastest growing motoring association.

They analysed 47,000 policies over a period of two and half years, and involving 33 manufacturers, to assess the number of repairs requested, as well as the cost of those fixes.

Subaru hit the No.1 spot - with just 3 in every 100 vehicles needing a claim-worthy repair in an average 12 month period.

Subaru cars were also only marginally more expensive to fix than a Nissan, too, with the average repair cost weighing-in at £420.

But Alfa Romeo was the brand most likely to break down - with 43 out of every 100 cars developing a fault each year - at an average cost of £215.

And Land Rover not only proved expensive to remedy - with average repair costs cheaper than only Porsche and Lexus - but they were also second from bottom in the chart.

Almost a third of Land Rover owners - 32 per cent - experience a fault each year, putting the British firm on a par with Chevrolet in the breakdown stakes.

Duncan McClure Fisher, Founder and CEO of MotorEasy said: "Land Rover is an iconic British brand, but our rankings show it has some work to do on the reliability front – they keep telling us their latest cars are more reliable but our stats show that if you own a Land Rover you must have warranty protection."

The vehicles covered were between 3 and 15 years old and the data covered more than 40,000 years' worth of warranty data overall.

The figures also confirmed and busted some age-old motoring beliefs. Alfa Romeo was near the bottom of the charts, reinforcing the brand's stereotype for frequent - but affordable - repairs.

But manufacturers traditionally viewed as unreliable, such as Fiat and Renault, proved more robust than many of their premium peers.

BMW and Audi were rooted at the bottom half of the table - deemed more likely to need fixing than a Renault.

McClure Fisher added: "Japanese cars remain as reliable as ever, with the likes of Subaru, Toyota, and Honda topping the charts.


"Honda's decision to close its Swindon plant is especially sad, considering the high-quality vehicles the manufacturer builds here in the UK.

"It's also concerning to see premium brands like Jaguar Land Rover, Audi and BMW at the bottom – suggesting their product quality may be slipping.

"If they are to hold on to their premium image in the future, this needs to be addressed."

The average repair costs across all manufacturers was found at £314.83, with premium brands costing the most on average to fix.

Will We are very pleased to be back. **Gus** When we looked at the figures it was the percentage of the audience, which increased, up 40% per cent for a 9pm slot that is incredible.

WHAT IS DIFFERENT ABOUT THE **NEW FLIPPING BANGERS OR IS IT MORE OF THE SAME?**

Gus We have done much newer cars. Oddly though the new car we did, an Audi TT won't be shown in the UK. It will be shown in Europe and Australia, which is a shame. That car was a leap of faith, especially for me and it made me a bit anxious.

Will I am not a fan of the more modern car. because we are not everyday mechanics and in the '80s if something had a computer it would scare you. So that was something we had to face up to. The core message we are trying to get across with the new series is still the same thing: it is Gus and me in a workshop with a job to do. We have put ourselves in the position where we are going to buy interesting cars. Sometimes they are good and sometimes they are rubbish. We are trying our level best with our hands, some tools and even some chewing gum at times to keep these things going. **Gus** I think the other thing that comes across in this series is a passion for particular car. I have a huge wish list which keeps on getting longer so if you buy a car that you are passionate about it comes across in the series. When you have a car that you love because it is quirky, or unusual, or because you have always wanted it. You know that the person watching as well as Will is going to get that. This for me has been the interesting journey in this series.

DID YOU GET MUCH FEEDBACK FROM VIEWERS OF THE FIRST SERIES ABOUT WHETHER THEY WERE INSPIRED TO BUY A BX AND NOW MY LIFE IS RUINED?

Gus We got some response through social media and they were keen to know what we were doing next.

Will We get lots of correspondence from Eastern Europe which was lovely, nice to have their support and we got the feeling we are working in the right direction.

IS THE POINT OF FLIPPING BANGERS STILL TO BUY A CAR. FIX IT UP AND THEN SELL IT AT A PROFIT?

Gus Exactly that and doing it in a timescale that works financially. We only do it if it is genuine; there is not an army of people behind us. If you add up the time and expenditure then you could not make a living doing this. But we end up making a TV programme. What do you think Will? Will There is money to be made, making the

television programme does get in the way. usually people do this in conjunction with having a relatively normal job as well. We are also committed to finding interesting cars rather than the most profitable.

Gus Watching the new series you can quickly work out which cars make the most profit and sadly it is the most modern ones. Z3 and Audit TT, once you start working on them they are brilliant. The TT's Golf platform is just phenomenal to work on. We took a lot of that car apart didn't we?

Will Yes and we put it all back together again and it still worked. Oh there was that hazard warning light switch which fell through the dashboard.

APART FROM THE AUDITT. WHICH WE WON'T SEE. WHAT WERE YOUR FAVOURITE **BANGERS?**

Gus For me it was the Reliant Kitten. We have this thing about maligned cars. However, once you dig into it is actually a rather advanced car, Morris was still producing the Marina with torsion bar suspension whereas the Kitten had double wishbone set up and all aluminum. So it was a well thought out and developed car in

a very British vein. I would like to champion that as an underdog.

Will Well I'm going to a Banger race this weekend featuring Reliants.

Gus Excellent.

Will I'll send you some photos. They might make you cry. The best car for me was the Skoda Estelle. Ouite simply when first available it was rubbished and we ended up with one that was original and stood the test of time and had been driven from Hungary I think. It was just brilliant. It drove really nicely and is very hipster cool and stood up very well indeed. I think you will really enjoy this series.

So why buy a car just to drive a few miles to the station each day? Why worry about leaving your pride and joy overnight in an urban street?


Bangernomics is actually a different



KEYLESS THEFT FORD FIGHT BACK



The UK's two top-selling cars in Fiesta and Focus are benefitting from new Ford security technology which disables their keyless entry fobs when not in use to block illegal hacking. Now, a new motion sensor inside the Ford fob detects when it has been stationary for longer than 40 seconds and triggers a sleep mode, which will not respond to attempts to hack its signal via a "relay box" or through the

misuse of other specialist equipment.

Moving the keyless fob by picking it up inside the home and taking it to the car will restore full functionality by the time Fiesta and Focus drivers approach their cars. Ford fobs are designed to operate only within a two-metre radius of the cars they are bonded to. Britain's best-selling car, the Ford Fiesta, plus the Fiesta Van version, are already being delivered with the new fobs as



standard at no extra cost.





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












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
