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

LANCIA CELEBRATES ITS 115 YEAR HISTORY..

The relationship between Lancia and cinema is very close and dates back to the early days of the 20th century, when Lancia cars appeared in the first silent films made in Turin. In particular, they would feature in the telefoni bianchi ('white telephones', 1930s Italian films in the style of the American comedies of the time), where these cars were chosen on the one hand as a vehicle for Italians' dreams to cross the threshold of mille lire al mese ('1000 Italian lire a month', the average salary at that time); on the other, almost as an embodiment of the key to the gates of the modern world. In the late 1950s, the bond between the car brand and the 'seventh art' became unbreakable. This was the time of La dolce vita, with Rome the capital of cinema and the international jet set: Via Veneto pulsated with life, its chic addresses and luxury hotels becoming destinations for actors and writers, while politicians and VIPs met at the tables of its trendy cafés. Many movie stars – including Claudia Cardinale, Anita Ekberg and Jean-Paul Belmondo – would choose Lancia cars: named Aurelia and Appia, they whizzed through the streets of Europe with style, sophistication and sensuality, just like true prima donnas taking to the stage. One of the standouts among the great Italian actors of the time was Marcello Mastroianni, a big fan of cars, whose favourite was his Flaminia Coupé Super Sport Zagato.

Brigitte Bardot also fell in love with Lancia and would drive its cars from Cortina d'Ampezzo to the Côte d'Azur, where she could be seen in the Aurelia B24, in the Flaminia, and later in the striking Flavia Convertible. In the same period, Ernest Hemingway – 1954 Nobel Laureate in Literature – was invited by the U.S. magazine Life to write a chronicle of the Spanish bullfighting season. The writer accepted the invitation, and left France in an Aurelia B21, which became his travel companion for The Dangerous Summer, a tome that would regale his readers. A few years later, the Aurelia B24 featured in Dino Risi's II sorpasso (1962) starring Catherine Spaak, Vittorio Gassman and Jean-Louis Trintignant, and definitely remains the most famous car seen in Italian cinema. Lancia cars more recently co-starred in highly successful films, including the Fulvia Coupé in Dario Argento's Profondo Rosso (1975), and the Lancia Delta with Alain Delon behind the wheel in Pour la peau d'un flic (1981). Not to mention the product placement of Lancia cars in major movies, such as the Thema and Delta in To Rome with Love (2012) – written and directed by Woody Allen – and the reappearance of the Delta in the Ron Howard thriller Angels & Demons (2009).

Admittedly, like those other Rolls-Royce motor cars, its power unit is from BMW (which owns Rolls-Royce), though it's no less than a V12 engine with a 6.75-litre cubic capacity.

As well as the daring Lipari Ochre, the exteriors of the Giulia and Stelvio "GT Junior" feature five-hole lightweight 21" alloy wheels on the Stelvio; 19" on the Giulia. Aluminum steering column shift paddles for the automatic transmission come as standard. with L2 ADAS systems, rear parking sensors, wireless charger and automatically operated tailgate available as optional extras.







fficially made from a piece of metal of a "Soyuz" space launcher and from the fabric of a space suit "Sokol", this Raketa 24-hour watch brings you very close to the experience of flying to space.

All of the incredible achievements of Soviet/ Russian cosmonauts over the past 60 years would not have been possible without the famous Soyuz space launcher. Thanks to its simplicity and reliability, this iconic space rocket has made over 1.700 flights since it was first engineered in the 1960s, and remains to this day by far the most frequently used space launcher in the world.

This watch is a tribute to this iconic space launcher. Its bezel is made from a metal piece of the space launcher "Soyuz-2.1a" which took off on 14 October 2020 and made a record breaking 3

Cars on Film OMMISSARIA



HE FRENCH DISPATCH, the new film from Oscar nominee and visionary filmmaker Wes Anderson, brings to life a collection of stories from the last issue of an American magazine of the same name published in a fictional 20th-century French town. The storyline unfolds in the imaginary town of Ennuisur-Blasé, evocative of France through the years.

Wes Anderson, Director of 'The French Dispatch' commented; "The visual base of the film, the costumes, the sets, everything... it's all informed by research. Even though it's a kind of confection and it's sort of invented stuff with a fantasy element to it, it is basically all grounded by reference."

An artistic collaboration with Citroën is clear throughout the film. Visiting the Citroën Conservatoire before filming began helped to identify which models would best suit the story, mainly with Traction and Type H. Other iconic Citroën models are also featured on the streets of the typically French town: 2 CV, Ami 6, DS and GS.

ANIMATED CAR CHASE IN A TRACTION Following the death of the editor of The French Dispatch, a widely distributed American magazine based in the French town of Ennui-sur-Blase, the team of writers all gather to write his obituary. Memories of the beloved boss flow into four stories making up the film, including "The Private Dining Room of the Police Commissioner". This part of the film carries overtones of French crime dramas from the 30s, 40s and 50s. At a crucial moment, the real-life images are replaced with an animation reminiscent of French comic books and the town where it was shot, Angoulême, known as the Cartoon Capital of France. The car chase takes place in the symbolic car of that period: the Traction!

This is not the first time Wes Anderson has featured Citroën vehicles in one of his films, in 'The Life Aquatic with Steve Zissou' (2004), Wes Anderson pays homage to Citroën twice: when Professor Zissou's crew goes to rescue hostages at the Hotel Citroën and when driving around their island base in a Yellow Méhari.



Alliance of British Drivers Driving Sense 'Global Climate Crisis' Fact Check

Antarctica: No warming for the past 70 years (3) and the past 6 months have been the coldest on record (4). Sea ice extent is still above the 1985 level (1).

Global Burning and Wildfires: The share of land burned globally has declined from 4.2% in 1900 to 2.5% in 2021. In California wildfires burned 12% of the state before 1800 and 4.2% in 2020 (5). The key human causes of wildfires remains deliberate arson, accidental fires and poor forest management.

Global Weather Losses: As a precentage of GDP, weather losses show a declining trend since 1990 (6).

Hurricanes: There's no upward trend in USA landfalling hurricanes since 1900, or total global hurricane energy since 1980 (6). **Tornadoes:** There's a declining trend for tornadoes since the 1950s including strong and violent tornadoes with 166mph wind speeds or over (6). **Sea Level Rise:** A paper published in Nature Climate Change in 2016 showed that the Earth's surface gained 115.000 SqKm of water and 173,000 SqKm of land over 30 years, including 20,135 SqKm of water and 33,700 SqKm of land in coastal areas (7). Also, pacific atoll Tuvalu has experienced an increase in land area over 2.9%. In fact 74% of islands in the pacific atoll group are larger now than they were 40 years ago (8).

Death Rates and Economic Damage: Climate-related deaths are down 80 – 90% during the past four decades, from flood, flash flood, coastal flood, cold, heatwaves and wind (2019 study published in Global and Environmental Change) (9). There are 10 times as many deaths from cold compared to heat. Since 1920 the climate-related death risk has fallen from 250 per 1 million people to 1 per 1 million in 2020 (Bjorn Lomborg) (10).

Global Crop Yields: Since the 1960s yields of maize, oats, wheat, rice and barley have increased signifcantly (Our World in Data) (11), no doubt helped by the greening of the Earth thanks to increased levels of atmospheric CO2 (Nature Climate Change/NASA 2016) (12). **Carbon Dioxide v Temperature in the 20th/21st Century:** During 1910 to 1945 the global average temperature increased by 0.4C, but was accompanied by only a 10 parts per million (ppm) increase in atmospheric CO2, and the temperature in the Arctic increased by 1.6C. Little or no warming occurred after 1945 until 1980 to 2018, when there was another 0.4C increase accompanied by a 97ppm rise in atmospheric CO2 – either CO2 was 10 times more powerful during 1910 to 1945, or the warming was mostly natural. Half of the 21st century temperature increase so far is due to the natural phenomenon know as El Nino.

Methane: One of the many bizarre claims being emitted by COP26 is that methane (CH4) is responsible for 50% of warming and we should stop eating meat/dairy products. Given that the level of methane in the atmosphere is around a tiny 0.00018%, it is therefore out-competed by much higher levels of the greenhouses gases CO2 (0.0417%) and water vapour (up to 4%) for absorption of infrared radiation, methane is largely irrelevant.

Implausible Climate Model Scenarios: After years of misuse, the UN IPCC's latest AR6 report finally declared model scenario RCP8.5 as having a 'low likelihood.' However, this hasn't stopped alarmist scientists using these scenarios to predict implausible outcomes for future climate, which are being publicised in the media for scaremongering purposes. If anyone knows what the global climate crisis or emergency is, then please let us know without relying on computer model predictions. The demonisation of carbon dioxide (CO2) is suicidal given the fact that at the end of the last glaciation atmospheric CO2 at 180ppm was dangerously close the threshhold for the survival of plant life on Earth. Despite ignorant politicans like Boris Johnson attacking the industrial revolution, which was the UK's greatest ever gift to itself and the world, the world is a richer and healthier place. Prior to the industrial revolution UK life expectancy from birth was little more than 35 years. The two main problems that need to be solved in the world are poverty and a lack of access to electricity. These problems won't be solved by the premature abandonment of oil, gas and coal.

Government must cut fuel duty and more...



Current pump prices are approximately 4p to 6p higher than they should be.

Wholesale prices of diesel and petrol have fallen significantly in the last week, yet retail filling up costs are continuing to rise.


- DRIVE 10 miles and you will see pump prices fluctuating by as much as 11p per litre. That's an outrageous £11 variance in filling up an average family car.
- With inflation jumping to its highest level in a decade as energy and fuel bills soar, the Government is not taking seriously enough the current rocketing high price of diesel and petrol.
- That vast VAT windfall, approaching £2bn filling the Exchequers coffers from these record prices at the pumps, is more than enough extra tax revenue, to warrant a decrease in Fuel Duty. Cutting Fuel Duty by at least 3p per litre will bring UK vehicle fuel taxation more in line with the EU average and allow businesses and logistics to invest in drivers and cleaner transport.
- India has just cut taxes on petrol and diesel too, all to ease consumer bills, so let's follow their lead!

Howard Cox, Founder of FairFuelUK said: High fuel prices are not saving the planet, they are crippling the economy, small businesses and low-income

families. It is in the power of this Government to put cash back into all our pockets by doing the fiscal right thing and ignore the green myopic pressure to tax and tax. Time for the Conservatives to revert to type and cut this regressive punitive levy and stop the opportunistic profiteering in the Fuel Supply Chain."

"If gas, electricity, water and telecoms get price protection bodies, why shouldn't motorists have one too? We need 'PumpWatch' now, to ensure pricing fairness for both consumers and hardworking fuel retailers too. Most of the profiteering is at wholesale level not by small independent retailers, who are also victims of the greedy fuel supply chain."

"Even President Biden's administration suspects foul play in the US fuel supply chain may be driving up the price of petrol. He has now called on the Federal Trade Commission, something akin to our impotent Competition and Markets Authority, to look into whether illegal conduct is driving up the cost of pump prices. Just like here in the UK, Americans are seeing rising costs, from prices at the pump to shopping at grocery stores."


PEUGEOT 205 GTI - CORRIGAN AMBERLEY PUBLISHING £14.99

Covers the engineering and design features that made the 205 so special. Within a stylish design, it offered a variety of lively petrol and diesel engines while the suspension, with MacPherson struts at the front and torsion arms with trailing arms at the back, offered excellent ride and handling. Soon the first GTI version was produced with an eager free-revving 1600 engine. In 1986 a 1900 version was introduced. Drawing on his personal experience of driving a renovated Peugeot 205 GTI, Matthew Corrigan also provides advice on restoration, parts, and other ownership tips.
